The Responsibility to Protect: Where Do We Stand Ten Years After? Book examines how R2P could be deployed, expanded, and even re-imagined, in order to achieve a world free of mass atrocities. It is intended to broaden debates and legal arguments concerning historic developments and the nature, role and potentials of R2P itself in a multidisciplinary debate reflecting diverse perspectives and thus genuine disagreements on the central theme of the book. Divided in five chapters the book evolves from predominantly doctrinal oriented contributions towards illustrations of concrete examples of (non)operationalization of R2P in practice.

The forward to the book was written by Dr Jennifer Welsh, the Special Adviser to the UN Secretary General on the Responsibility to Protect, which recognized the book as an important contribution "by suggesting where those committed to advancing the collective responsibility to protect populations should focus their energies over the next decade, and beyond."
